UNIFORM

UNDER 12, UNDER 16, SENIOR AND MASTERS

Judging

Compliance with the uniform requirements is conducted during the Technical Drill phase and covered by the Technical B Judge.

Uniform Requirements

Under 12, Under 16 & Senior Grades a Jacket, Blouse Tunic, Coat or Polo shirt

(long or short sleeved)

b Skirts/Shortsc Underweard Footwear

Masters Grade a Jacket, Blouse Tunic, Coat or Polo Shirt

(long or short sleeved)

b Full length Trousers

c Underweard Footwear

It is permissible for a one piece uniform combining a and b.

It is permissible for more than one member to wear a whistle.

Mixed gender teams -

Females - skirts or shorts

Males - shorts, headwear; as an alternative to the teams chosen headwear males may opt for a cap or visor

Masters Grade - full length trousers

Single gender teams -

Every Member - skirts or shorts Masters Grade - full length trousers

Judging of the Uniform Presentation Requirements will be covered by the Display A Judge under the heading Uniform Presentation

Presentation Requirements -

All Uniforms will -

- Be clean, neat and tidy.
- Give the appearance of uniformity within the team.
- Maintain dignity, modesty and decency standards.

Headwear (optional)

Teams should consider being "Sunsmart". Caps and visors are acceptable.

Trousers

Trousers length must be such that it does not preclude any aspect of foot action being fully judged.

Jackets

Sleeve length must be such that it does not preclude any aspect of hands being fully judged.

Handcoverings

If worn, must be a neat fit and uniform colour throughout the team. The colour of the gloves must contrast with the main colour of skirts, trousers or shorts and the bottom 10cm of the sleeve and must be such that it does not preclude any aspect of the hands being fully judged.

Footwear

Boots or sports shoes are permissible. The main colour must be uniform throughout the team. Socks, if worn, must be the same colour throughout the team.

Underwear

Underwear must be uniform colour throughout the team. It must not be transparent and must cover the buttock of the wearer.

Jewellery

Permanent plain gold or silver sleepers or studs worn through pierced ears are permitted by individual team members. Other forms of jewellery are not permitted unless worn uniformly throughout the team as ornamentation.
