HAPPY BIRTHDAY

GARNET

This beautiful stone, which is most commonly red but can be found in a range of other colors, symbolizes peace, prosperity and good health. Some say it even has the power to give the wearer eternal happiness, health and wealth. The word "garnet" comes from the 14th Century Middle English word "gernet" meaning dark red. The word is derived from Latin "granatum" which means seed, and is called so because of the gemstone's resemblance to the beautifully red seeds of the pomegranate. Garnet is actually the name of a group of minerals that comes in a rainbow of colors, from the deep red of the Pyrope garnet to the vibrant green of Tsavorites. Some rare garnets are even blue, colorless, or, most rare of all, change colors in different lights. But the most common color is a beautiful range of reds, from rust colored to deep violet-red.

HEALTH TIP

You could save a life – learn the symptoms of an allergic reaction. Anaphylaxis is a serious, potentially fatal allergic reaction. Symptoms of an allergic reaction can range from mild to severe, and can include one or more of the following;

MOUTH: swelling (tongue and/or lips), itchy mouth, blue-tinged lips

THROAT: trouble breathing/swallowing/speaking, tightness, hoarseness

LUNGS: repetitive cough, shortness of breath, wheezing

HEART: faintness, weak pulse, dizziness, confusion, paleness

SKIN: hives, itchy rash, swelling, flushing

GUT: vomiting, diarrhoea, crampy pain

OTHER: sense of impending doom, loss of consciousness

QUICK MARCH #112 - September 1960

Sargettes' Cup for Fiji

In 1958 the Sargettes (Wellington) marching team visited Suva, Fiji for the Hibiscus Festival and when the team learned that marching was being started in Fiji they promised to donate a trophy for competitions. Last July their promise was fulfilled when Mrs L Ferretti of Lower Hutt presented a handsome cup to Mr V Hugo, President of the Fiji Marching Association.

The occasion was an informal one which took place at Mr & Mrs Hugos home in Suva. Unfortunately, Mrs M Wendt, one of the originators of the sport in Fiji was unable to be present. Mrs Ferretti was visiting Fiji on holiday and was looking forward to a display to be given by the Suva marching teams in aid of the combined Red Cross and St John Building Appeal and also to seeing some of the teams in training.

Fiji Teams marched creditably...

The first Fiji Marching Championships attracted a crowd of about 1000 people. The contest was originally scheduled to be held at a park in the suburbs of Suva, but torrential rain literally 'washed out' this idea. Thanks to some snappy work by members of the Executive another ground was arranged for the Monday. Executive members cut the grass and marked out the ground with the help of Suva City Engineer.

The 'emergency' ground had no facilities for gate collection, but it says a great deal for the enjoyment of the large crowd present that the (particularly for Suva, where the basic wage is under 4 pound per week) large sum of 15 pound 15 shillings and 81/2 pence was collected in a blanket taken round by 2 marching girls.

The Trophy for the Championship was given by Mrs L E Willoughby and another splendid shield was given by Mr & Mrs Hugo for the Display. Lady Maddocks, Patron of the Fiji Marching Association, has also given a Trophy, but as this had not yet been received from England it will be handed to the winners of the uniform contest at a later date. Three sets of medals had also been donated.

Judges positions covered were for No 1, No 2, No 3, No 4, Leader on the March Leader at Halt, Fall In and Inspection, Pace Counter, Display and Costume.
